Enforcement site visit 2/8/21, very concerned over the trees with TPO's cut to short trunks. Unable at that time to gain access to the site itself to consider the pigeon loft that looks like an annex.

27th September – The Pigeon Loft is not being used as accommodation and has been clad in brick effect rather than brick itself, therefore no breach of planning control.

Trees with TPO's – investigation on going. Chased as no further update as of 22nd November.

A member of the public raised concerns over the number of caravans sited down Charlton Lane at Torton Paddock. W/15/01391/PN was approved for 1 x residential static caravan and 1 x touring caravan only, more caravans on site than approved and has been taken up with enforcement. Noticeably the fencing right between the field and allotments down. Also the fence right of the cattle fence top rail removed. The Allotment Advisory Group has been asked to obtain an urgent quote to secure the site.

Gate Access onto the Allotment Land.

There should be no access onto the private allotment land from the houses on Old Worcester Road. Letter issued to that effect posted 23rd November. Out of the 12 houses that back onto the ground. 7 had now installed gates and 1 seemed to continually fly tip grass cuttings onto the land.

Loose Pony

Complaint raised with the RSPCA, phone call 1st December, pony returned to waste ground by the bungalow, WDC phone number given to the RSPCA as waste ground belongs to them. Pony appears not to be chipped.
